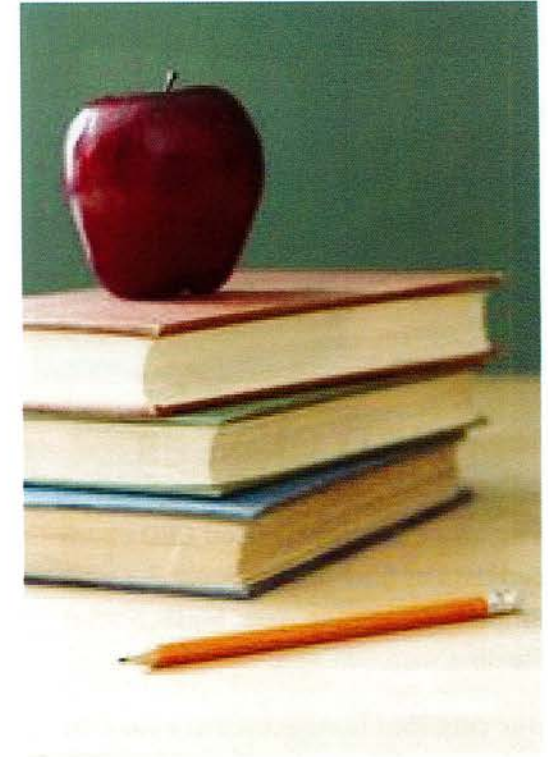

## GED Classes

The new computer-based GED exam consists of four parts:

English/Language Arts, Math, Social Studies, and Science.

Our certified instructors are here to help you prepare to pass all four parts of the exam.

Free semester classes are offered in the Fall and Spring each year. Small class sizes and personalized instruction will meet your needs as you prepare to earn your GED.

## English for Speakers of Other Languages



ESOL classes are for students whose native language is not English. Each semester, free 13 week classes are held at three levels:

**Pre-Beginner** – for the student who has little or no experience with English.

**Beginner** – for the student who has limited English skills. Emphasis is on vocabulary, conversation, and listening skills.

**Intermediate** – for the student who has completed the ESOL Beginner class. Emphasis is on growing vocabulary, written and conversational skills.
