


Simsbury Music and Performing Arts Newsletter



Stuart originally connected with Simsbury via the Hartt Partnership before coming on board as the Director of the Simsbury High School Choir program. After successfully increasing the quality of the program and the overall enrollment of the choirs, Stuart received the distinguished designation as Simsbury Teacher of the Year in 2012. Stuart eventually became the director of the One Act Play Festival, the SHS Musical, and the SHS Spring Play. Affectionally known as "Doc" by his students, Stuart has directed over 19 theatrical productions of the SHS Musical, designed the model for our current theater curriculum, and the rest is history!
